Similarly under Alternative & Innovative Education programme we have mainstreamed 30 tribal girls to nearest primary schools. .All these were possible with the guidance provided by different district officials.

By the support of DPEP/SSA in Malkangiri we have initiated measures of establishing a special school & survey of 30 children with disabilities are made for the admission in the coming academic session.

We also carried out our regular community mobilization and sensitization work for women empowerment, community health and environment etc. Through micro-credit support; we contributed to the enhancement in household income of the needy families of the area.

Credit for all these support goes to the individuals and organizations, which have extended their financial and moral support at different stages of execution. I would like to acknowledge their contribution and express my sincere gratitude to these individuals and organizations for being a part of SEED's vision of creating a healthy society. I anticipate their similar cooperation & support in the coming years, thus boosting our morale and giving us the impression that we are not alone in the track of societal development.

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Introduction

Social Education for Environment and Development (SEED), a voluntary organization is formed by a group of social workers and development practitioners in 1991. It works for socio-economic and cultural development of the aboriginal tribe in Malkangiri district, the most remote and underdeveloped districts of Orissa.

The organization, in all its development programmes, emphasizes on generating awareness among the people on their socio-economic and cultural status in the society and sensitizes them to avail their rights and privileges as members of the society. The organization strives to establish social welfare and justice through participatory efforts and planned approach towards development with the active participation of the concerned community (particularly Koya tribe) at all levels of its effort. SEED is managed by a group of committed and experienced rural development professionals, who extend their services by working with the community in tribal areas. Over a period, the organization is engaged in various developmental activities, especially in the field of Education, Livelihood, Environment, Women Empowerment, Health and Capacity Building etc. of tribal people in Korkunda block of Malkangiri district.

Legal Status

SEED has been registered under the State Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. The organization is also registered under Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) in 2005 and the Regd. No. is 105090006.

Vision

A healthy society, which is ecologically sustainable and empowered to deal with the rising issues to lead a better and qualitative life with access and control over basic minimum facilities for survival in the present trend of development.

Mission

- " Creation of a society free from exploitation
- " Proper utilization of the resources for the development of the poor.
- " Reduce poverty and dependency syndrome.
- " Creation of field for social justice.
- " Eradication of illiteracy and provision for higher education coupled with the transfer of knowledge and skills.
- " Up gradation of environment.
- " Solving local problems and creation of classless society.
- " Lowering of the death rate and enhancing the quality of life.
- " Rehabilitation for the differently abled persons.

Approach

SEED believes in the latent power of the community and hence tries to upgrade and enhance their capacities and skills thus restoring the confidence among them. The organization facilitates an environment that enables each individual in the community to get access as well as control over the common resources. It promotes people's organization and builds up them to stand on their own without depending on external support for long.

Area of Operation

Since the inception SEED has made direct or indirect impact on lives of nearly 100,000 people. Out of the total one lakh population SEED has the direct association with 50,000 people. The organization is working in most remote and backward district of Orissa, namely, Malkangiri that is located at a distance of 750 KM from the state capital.

Target People

The organization has been working for the upliftment of the deprived and underprivileged sections of the society, primarily the Scheduled Tribe, Scheduled Caste and Other Backward Classes. More than ninety percent of the present target population of SEED is ST and SC.

Vulnerable sections of the society, especially, the distressed women, children and bonded laborers, persons with disabilities and landless persons are always prioritized in the interventions undertaken by SEED.

Education

Education is the fulcrum of development, without the access to education a society will be completely in disarray. Right blend of education and information to a community is a major factor of development. In this era of Information Technology, a country gets rated of its advancement & modernity by one of its crucial yardstick of the adoption of IT & its penetration to the daily life styles of the people at all its nook & corners. Of late Internet, Mass media etc have served immensely, providing updated information to the people at their door steps. Though India is moving faster in launching with IT networks still it has not reached to the expectation of penetration at the grass roots. Village resource centers are contemplated to be set up in very near future but the utility of it in remote area of multi linguistic & ethnic group is not ascertained so far.

Educational Complex for Tribal Girls

SEED has taken a major step for the education of tribal girls. As a result, from February 1999 SEED established a residential Educational Complex for the tribal girls at village S. Tandapalli of Korukunda Block of Malkanagiri district of Orissa.

Through the educational complex we have been providing primary education to the tribal girls from Class 1st to Class 5th. Through this institution we facilitate joyful learning by physical exercises, yoga, and intake of nutritious food, game & sports for all round development of the tribal girls. During this year strength of girl students was 70 and out of those 9 girls is promoted to nearest ME schools (Govt. recognized) of Satigoda and Kalimella.



Alternative Innovative Education for Tribal Girls (AIEC)

Development is correlated with education but literacy rate is very low in KBK areas. However, the National DPEP / SSA programme has taken major positive role to accelerating the girls' education in our country.

By the support of DPEP / SSA in Malkanagiri we have incepted residential girls' education in our campus & after one year 30 tribal girls have been mainstreamed to nearest primary and upper primary school. The centre exhibited an aesthetic look with tiny children moving around in the campus the environment of learning. The residential center is appreciated by DPEP, Malkanagiri.



Special School for the Children with Hearing and Speech Disabilities (CWSN)

In order to extend education & rehabilitation support to the children with disabilities we have proposed to establish a special school under the aegis of DPEP programme.

In this context we have surveyed the neighboring villages & identified 30 children who will be admitted in the rehabilitation center in the next academic session.

NCLP (National Child Labour Programme)

Every child is the future citizen of our country and they would be taking major role for nation building. Unfortunately some children bonded by various sectors of agricultural & indoor chores in our society have been away from quality education which is needed for the future citizens.

To facilitate that programme, Govt. and Human Resources Department have handed over two (2) NCLP centers at Korukonda block of Malkanagiri district for 100 children.



Women Empowerment Programme :

There is no meaning without women empowerment in the context of present development scenario. So SEED has continuously paid special efforts for women empowerment. So that SEED is directly and indirectly working with 65 nos. of SHGs in Korukunda & Malkanagiri block of Malkanagiri district in Orissa.



Special efforts for women empowerment:

- ◆ SHG's information on development aspects
- ◆ Facilitate thrift and credit system
- ◆ Bank linkages and participation in various poverty eradication programme.
- ◆ Sensitize about community health care system.
- ◆ Sensitization on Right To Information (RTI), etc.

Health:

Health is another core activity of SEED in KBK areas of Orissa. Basically tribal communities are very poorly sensitized in health aspect. As a result, paid minimal attention on health care system existing in the village level.

Strategy for Health Care:

- ◆ To regularize discussion in monthly meeting
- ◆ To organize health camp regarding
 - a) Safe drinking water
 - b) TB & Leprosy
 - c) Five free facilitated diseases
 - d) Women and child health care
 - e) Small family norm
 - f) Malnutrition and alternative nutrition
 - g) HIV, AIDS and Sexual diseases.



Environment Awareness

Environment and development suggested by the name of the organization is the two core areas of SEED. To be sensitized regarding environment SEED continuously handles the programme in following process.

- ◆ Organizes community regarding deforestation.
- ◆ Celebration of Vano Mohotsava(Forest Fete)
- ◆ Motivates to community and SHGs for cleaning of pond, tube well and drains.
- ◆ Awareness generation of the various forestation and environment development programme by Government.

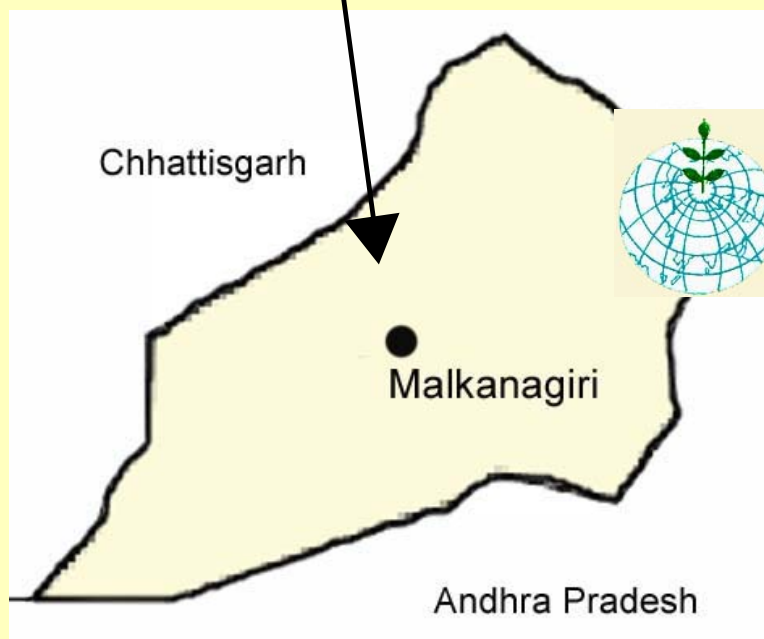
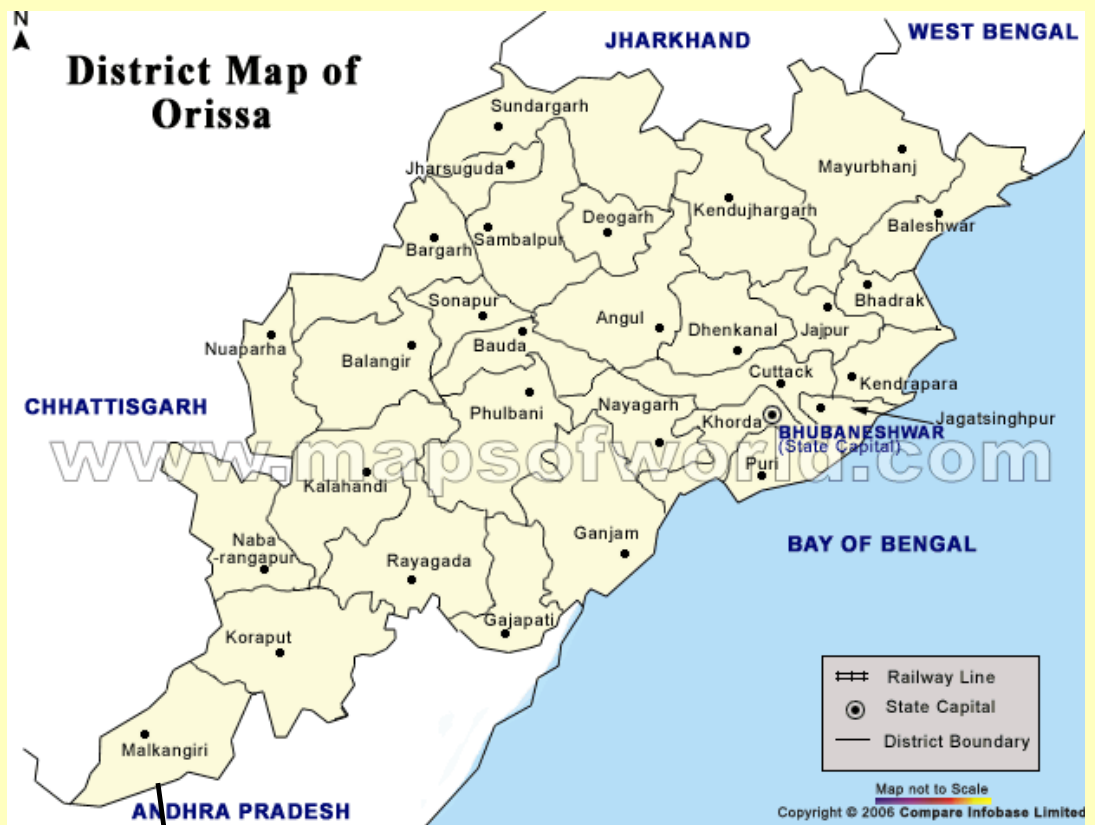
