Social Education for Environment and Development (SEED), a voluntary organization formed in the year 1991 by a group of committed social workers. Since inception, it has been working for socio-economic and cultural development of the aboriginal tribes in Malakanagiri District of Orissa.

Legal status

SEED has been registered under the State Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860. The Organization is also registered under FCRA in 2005 and Regd. No. is 105090006.

Vision

A healthy society which is ecologically sustainable and empowered to deal with the rising issues to lead better and qualitative life with access and control over basic minimum facilities for survival in the present trend of development.

Mission

- ◆ Creation of a society free from exploitation.
- ◆ Proper utilization of the resources for the development of the poor
- ◆ Reduce poverty and dependency syndrome
- ◆ Creation of field for social justice
- ◆ Eradication of illiteracy and provision for higher education coupled with transfer of knowledge and skills.
- ◆ Up gradation of environment
- ◆ Solving local problems and creation of a classless society.
- ◆ Lowering the death rate and enhancing the quality of life.
- ◆ Rehabilitation for differently able persons.

Approach

Seed believes in the latent power of the community and hence tries to up grade their capacities and skills and restoring the confidence among them. The organization facilitates an environment that enables each individual in the community to get access as well control over the common resources. It promotes people's organization and builds up them to stand on their own without depending on external support for long.

Area of operation

Since the inception SEED has made direct or indirect impact on lives of nearly 100,000 people. Out of the total one lakh population SEED has direct association with 50,000 thousand people. The organization is working in most remote and back ward districts of Orissa, namely, Malkanagiri that is located at distance of 750 KM from state Capital.

Target persons

The organization has been working for the up-liftment of the deprived and under privileged sections of society, primarily the Schedule Tribe, Schedule Caste and Other Back ward Classes. More than ninety per cent of the present target population of the SEED is ST and SC.

Vulnerable sections of society, especially, the distressed women, children and bonded laborers, persons with disabilities and landless persons are always prioritized in the intervention under taken by SEED.

EDUCATION

EDUCATIONAL COMPLEX FOR TRIBAL GIRLS

SEED is running an educational complex for Tribal Girls at Tandapalli village of Korukonda block, Malkangiri district since February 1998. The educational complex is popularly known as SEED Kanyashram. The sole Mission of the ECTG is to increase women literacy in Malkangiri district.



The teachers use different innovative methods to enhance the mental ability of the children and create enthusiasm among children to learn. The children are imparted joyful education through song, dance, story, game and various teaching learning materials. Globes and maps are used to augment the knowledge of students' on geographical situation.

The school has included practice of 'YOGA' in curriculum, as measure to bring mental peace, stability, increase remembrance and for leading a health life. On every Saturday morning the students practice various Yoga asana like Surya Namaskar, Nabasana, Bakasana, Sukhasana, Brukshyasana, Padmasana, Bajrasana, Dhanurasan, Bhmrari, Ardhakati chakrasana etc.

Out of 120 girls 07 were enrolled in nearest UP School for pursuing higher education.

Mother committee

A mother committee has been formed which encompasses 25 mothers from 25 villages. The mother committee assembles on monthly basis and discuss with the Head Mistress and teachers on topics like nutritious food, use of mosquito net, study, teaching learning materials, health check up and drinking water etc. They also suggested and shared new idea with staff and management of SEED for successful implementation of the progamme.



Through this committee many queries can be brought into discussion with the management of the school for better solution and could established constructive suggestions for future development. During last financial year they found more energetic and extend their plateful hand to promote education in their area.

Health check up:

The health check up of students has been conducted by the medical team of Kurkunda PHC in each month. The main objective to organize these camps is to make the students physically fit so that they can devote their time for better education. To achieve the said objective the school takes utmost care to fulfill the requirement of nutritious food and drinking water for children. ANM of the area discusses on personal hygiene and nourishing food in every month to aware the students to maintain good health. During health check up camp medical team also discussion with children and staff about different aspect of preventive measures for prevention and control of diseases, personal health and hygienic, sanitation etc.



Observation of Festivals

SEED observes various important festival days with active participation of projects staffs, students, parents and general community through out the year.

Sri Ganesh Puja, Saraswati Puja, Rakshyabandhan, Gandhi jayanti, Teachers day, Children's day, Independence day, Republic day, Utkal divas, Netaji jayanti, Annual sports and Annual function. Etc, of the ECTG are observed with much pump and joy for all round development of the tribal girls. Along with this



Annual sport and cultural events has been organized by SEED in its own campus premises and rewarded to the winner children of the Kanyashram. Because of this the students as well as parents feel encouraged for school.

SPECIAL SCHOOL FOR CHILD LABOR (NCLP)

Under the support Ministry Human Resource Govt. Of India SEED is running two Special school for child labor (NCLP) constituting of 100 children in Patnagoda and Chitapari(1) village of Korkounda Block of Malkangiri district. SEED provides quality education, nutrition food, and cultural activities to attract children to school. This programme has a greater impact in the locality to make the unprivileged children educated and help them to be a part of the literate society.
